

## 1 Project Aim

To Improve the dissemination of evidence – based recommendations by building on the work of the GRADE Working Group to develop and evaluate methods that address the targeted dissemination of guidelines

### Highlights

- WP1 are working to have the interactive EtR table for users ready by September for user testing and are working closely with WP6 to implement the strategies gradually.
- WP3 are conducting user tests in different geographic areas and with different social groups. A mock-up of breast cancer patient version is being prepared and also a literature review report is being drafted.
- WP5 report that the interactive Summary of Findings table (iSOF) is ready for user testing. Three user tests have been completed on participants from the target audience of health service and public health decision makers.
